

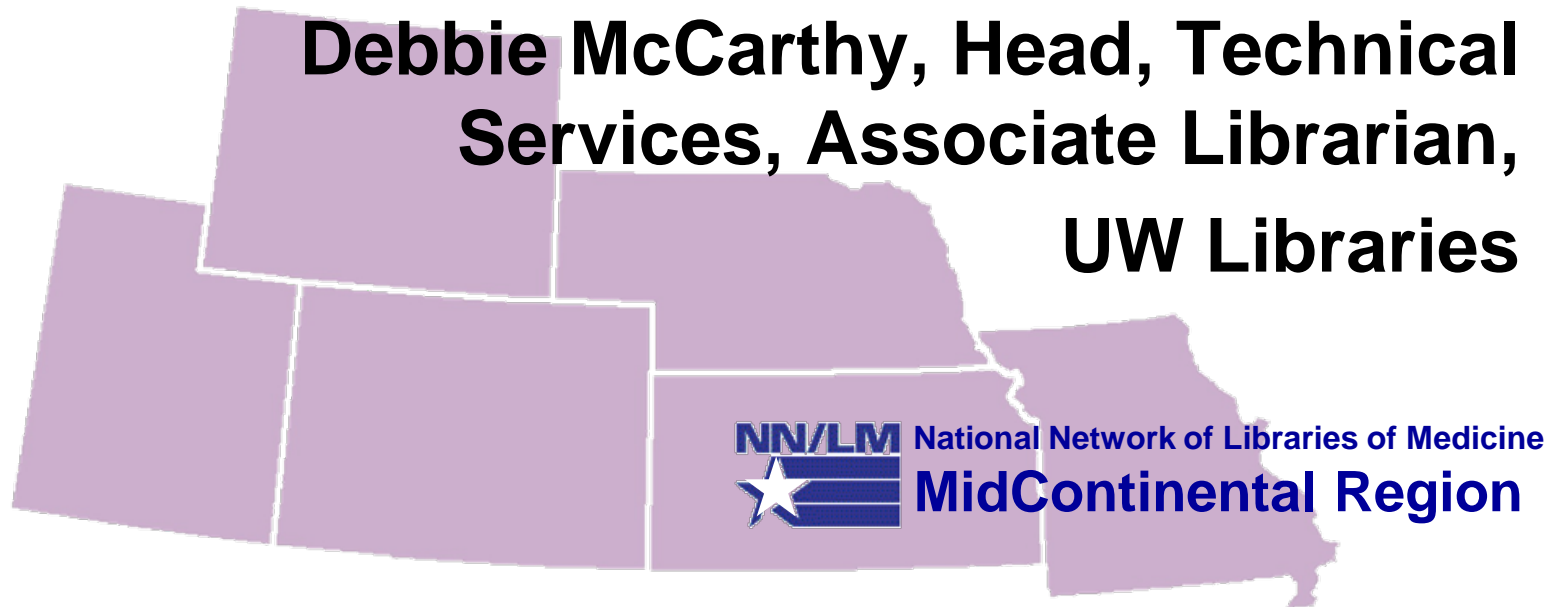

## Top 5 Worst Summers

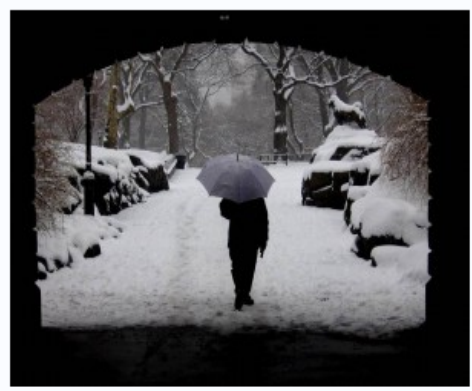



## Overall Outcomes

- Information on MCRML operations including contact information, communications information and daily procedures are known *and communicated*.
- Procedures for MCRML to follow before, during and after a disaster are established and communicated.
- Role of RML and Resources Libraries during an emergency and in emergency planning are known and communicated.

## COMMUNICATION

MCRML communication channels, including but not limited to voicemail, listservs, email aliases, blog, etc login and passwords will be stored in the staff wiki.
